Messages from Mr Butler

CENSUS DAY- Thursday 3 October

Next Thursday is Census Day and we need your help. Our funding from the Government is dependent on the number of children booking a Free School Meal, especially in Key Stage 1, on Census Day. We have pizza and ice cream on the menu so please do your bit and book your child's lunch.

PLEASE HELP—The only way we can access extra funding- known as Pupil Premium is, if you are eligible, that you apply for Free School Meals. Eligibility is for those on a low income in receipt of some benefits.

With school budgets shrinking yearly in real terms due to increasing costs we rely on this extra funding which helps pay for many things in School such as resources and extra staffing. Even if your child is in Key Stage 1 and receives a free meal please apply if you qualify and your child does not have to take up the free school meal if they prefer to bring a packed lunch.

September 2025—Looking ahead, please book a tour for you and your child if they are due to start Reception in September 2025. We will be happy to show you round and answer any questions you may have about your child starting school. We also have places in our Nursery. Please contact the office for further information.

Earrings—On PE days, please ensure that your child either comes to School not wearing earrings or that they can remove them independently. Staff are not permitted to remove earrings from children's ears.

OSCA — We are very lucky to have our Breakfast and After School Club at Ashwood Park. Please could I ask that you complete the OSCA Registration paperwork before booking your child in for their first session. And could I remind you that to ensure safe staffing ratios all OSCA sessions <u>must</u> be pre—booked. If your child would like to eat a breakfast they must arrive by 8.15am. Please let Mrs Oakes or Miss Webb know if your contact details change.

Peanut Allery Advice

Allergy UK has received an urgent statement from the Foods Standards Agency (FSA) regarding a potential allergen contamination issue affecting anyone with a peanut allergy. The FSA is advising people with a peanut allergy to avoid consuming foods that contain or may contain mustard, mustard powder, or mustard flour due to potential contamination with peanuts. These mustard ingredients are often found in food such as dips. sauces, salads and pre-packed sandwiches. The FSA is taking a precautionary approach and is advising any individual living with or caring for anyone with a peanut allergy, to avoid eating any product that contains or may contain mustard until the specific affected products identified.

This survey is for parent carers of children/ young people with special educational needs or disabilities (SEND) between the ages of 0-25 and living in Dudley.

We want to hear about your recent experiences with a range of different services. To keep this information up to date and relevant we will sometimes ask you to think about your experiences within a certain timeframe (eg previous 12 months).

We understand that if you have more than one child your experiences may vary for each child. Therefore we ask that you complete a separate survey for <u>each child</u> with SEND that you have.

We will use the information provided to ensure we focus our work on the areas that are most important to you. We will share the results of this survey with our members and wider networks as well as local services. We will also share the results of this survey with Ofsted or the Department for Education (DfE) during any inspections of SEND services. We will never share any identifying information.

Starting secondary school in September 2025

Why not apply for a place online?

If your child is due to start secondary school in 2025 then you will have to apply for a school place before 31 October 2024.

You **MUST** complete an application form either online at **www.dudley.gov.uk/admissions** or by completing the application form provided by your home local authority. You can include six school preferences on the application form; there is nothing to gain by only putting one preference.

Benefits of applying online

- · E-mail decision received by 2pm on day of offer
- · It's quick and easy to use
- · You can apply 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- . There's no risk that your application will be lost in the post
- · You will get email confirmation that your application has been received
- · It's safe and secure

The online system will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from 1 September 2024 until the closing date for applications on **31 October 2024**.

You should not assume that your child will get a place at a secondary school without you having to apply, even if you have an older child already attending the same school. This is a common misconception and often the biggest cause of disappointment for parents who believe otherwise.

Free School Meals

If you receive any of the following support payments your child may be entitled to Free School Meals

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit Run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

If you currently receive free school meals but have now moved into the area, you will need to complete a new Free School Meals Application form




